




The employment relationship: a comparative overview

Global wage report 2010/11: wage policies in times of crisis

The second in a series of ILO reports focusing on wage developments, this volume reviews the global and regional wage trends during the years of the economic and financial

crisis of 2008 and 2009.

This report provides some evidence about the impact of the crisis on wage around the world. It shows in particular that the global growth in real average wages was reduced by half in 2008 and 2009, compared to earlier years. This highlights how while the crisis has been dramatic for those who lost their jobs, smaller than expected paychecks have also severely affected the purchasing power and well-being of those who managed to stay in work.


Negotiating for social justice: high-level tripartite meeting on collective bargaining

List of occupational diseases (revised 2010). Identification and recognition of occupational diseases: criteria for incorporating diseases in the ILO list of occupational diseases


In today's increasingly complex world of work, the number of chemical,

Handbook on the optional protocol on the sale of children, child prostitution, and child pornography




