




Global employment trends 2011: the challenge of a jobs recovery



The annual *Global Employment Trends* (GET) report provides the latest global and regional estimates of employment and unemployment, employment by sector, vulnerable employment, labour productivity and working poverty, while also analyzing country-level issues and trends in the labour market. The report reveals that despite an ongoing economic recovery from the worst global economic crisis, a comparable recovery in jobs has not taken shape. With 205 million unemployed in the world, an additional 1.5 billion workers trapped in vulnerable employment and over 600 million workers living with their families in extreme poverty, a lagging labour market recovery represents not only a waste of human potential but a threat to future growth and recovery.




World migration report 2010. The future of migration: building capacities for change


International productivity monitor

Independent external evaluation of the International Labour Office evaluation function


The purpose of the Independent External Evaluation (IEE) is to provide an independent assessment of the evaluation function within the ILO to provide recommendations on the


International Labour Office: annual evaluation report 2009-2010


The agency work industry around the world: economic report






