



The role of collective bargaining in the global economy: negotiating for social justice


This book examines the ways in which collective bargaining addresses a variety of workplace concerns in the context of today's global economy. Globalization



RADIATION PROTECTION




Radiation protection of workers

The purpose of this Information Note is to provide information about the size of the workforce affected by, and the occupational activities associated with, exposure to radiation and the relevant ILO instruments on the protection of workers.

The use of radioactive sources involves risks due to radiation exposure. Exposure to ionizing radiation occurs in many occupations. Artificial sources of radiation are commonly used in the manufacturing and service industries, in defence industries, in research institutions and universities, and in the nuclear power industry.

ILO introductory report: global trends and challenges on occupational safety and health




This introductory report concerns some of the achievements and challenges of the last three years for building such a preventive safety and health culture. How to meet these challenges will be

2009 pilot survey on commercial sexual exploitation of children (CSEC). Final report




The Statistical Monitoring Information Programme on Child Labour (SIMPOC), which is the statistical unit of the International Programme on the Elimination of Child Labour




