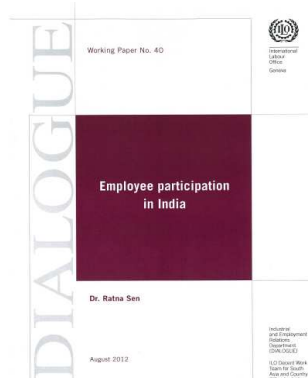
Are "green" jobs decent? International Journal of Labour Research

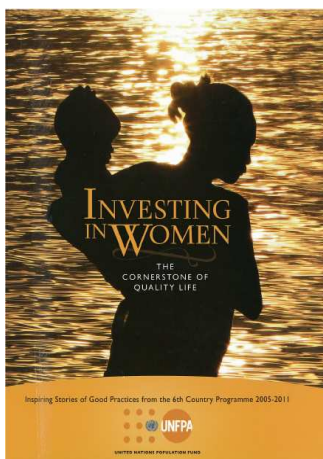


Work in Fishing Convention and Recommendation, 2007. Action plan, 2011-2016

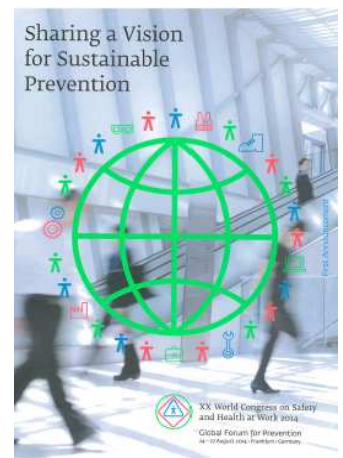

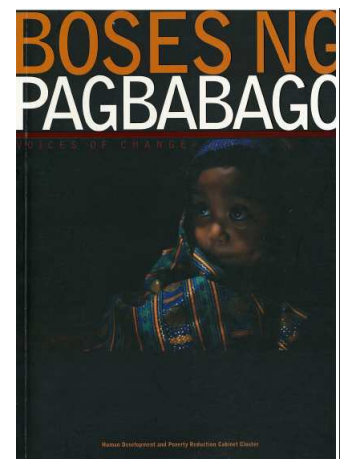
