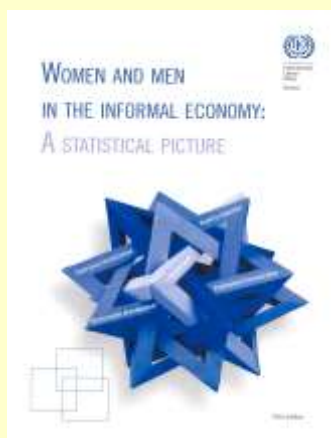

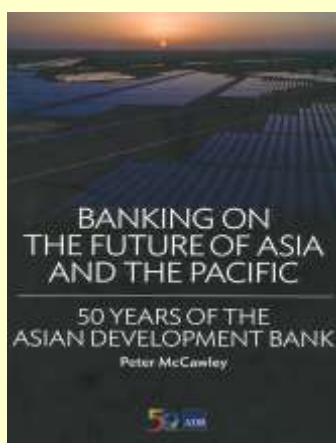
Greening with jobs: World employment social outlook, 2018
