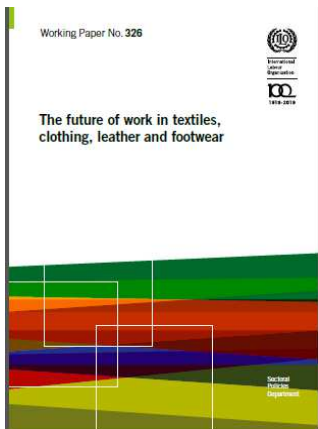
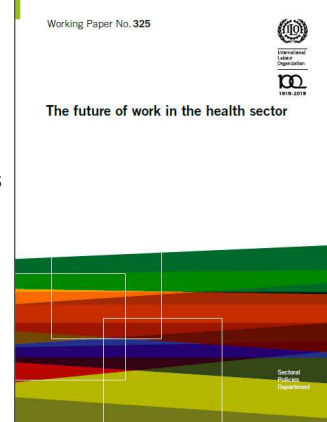
The future of work in the health sector

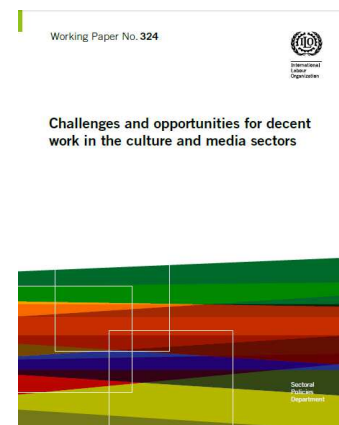

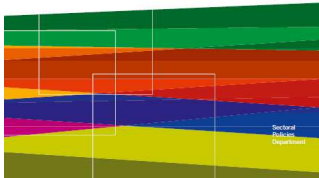

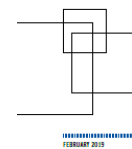
