




Core elements of a bilateral agreement or a memorandum of understanding on labour migration

The increasing complexity of the migration of workers across borders highlights the importance of International cooperation in the governance of migration processes and the protection of migrant workers. Such cooperation on migration can take

various forms ranging from multilateral and regional frameworks to national-level arrangements. In general, multilateral and regional frameworks and agreements to govern migration are preferable because bilateral arrangements can be affected by unequal power relations of the member States.


