
Global employment trends for youth 2020: Technology and the future of jobs




ILO100 – Law for social justice

The publication provides information on revenue bodies in Asia and the Pacific to support efforts of developing member countries to strengthen their tax administration systems. Improved tax systems can help countries


in the region generate the resources needed to implement the Sustainable Development Goals.
