

Gap analysis and recommendations on laws on child labour and working conditions in artisanal small-scale mining

The Artisanal and Small-Scale Gold Mining (ASGM) sector is considered “a vital contributor to the Philippine economy.

Studies estimate that 200,000 to 300,000 miners and their families in 20 to 30 provinces in the Philippines rely on ASGM as a primary source of subsistence. Of the estimate, about 18,000 are women and children. By the ILO approximation, the number may be as many as 500,000 across the country.
