2012:200 million unemployed out of 3.3 billion workers



75 million youth unemployed

Young people are nearly 3 times as likely as adults to be unemployed



ILO Global Employment Trends






... to absorb the 40 million new entrants into the labour force each year and the backlog of 200 million unemployed

2011 is estimated at 1.52 billion


increase of 136 million since 2000 and of nearly 23 million since 2009



Philippines: Unemployment Rate









THE PHILIPPINE LABOR & EMPLOYMENT PLAN 2011-2016






Supply and demand of workers in the Philippines

Monitoring and Assessing Progress on Decent Work (MAP)






Support from the European Commission
