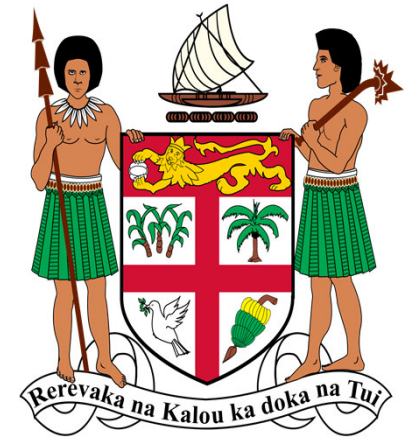

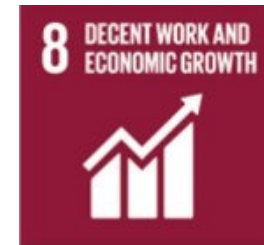

Project Outcomes



Recognizing the importance of addressing needs in a localized manner and the distinct cultures of the countries, **all activities will be contextualized to the local communities**

The programme is structured under **four outcomes**



Outcome 1: Pacific governments demonstrate improved labour migration governance

- Pacific governments and regional stakeholders have a regional approach to strengthen labour mobility governance, including as a climate resilience strategy





Outcome 2: Decent work principles and standards are at the core of Pacific labour migration programmes

- Pacific governments have reviewed or developed **labour migration laws and policies**, ensuring they are rights-based and gender responsive and improve support services, protection of the rights of workers, and recruitment
- Pacific governments and social partners (workers' and employers' organizations) have **improved information, tools and mechanisms** to implement rights-based and gender responsive laws and policies in programme countries
- Migrants have improved access to **complaints mechanisms**



Outcome 3: Pacific governments contribute to the delivery of safe and regular labour migration programmes

- Governments have increased capacity to **deliver training programmes** that benefit migrant workers
- Pacific governments and relevant stakeholders have increased understanding and skills to support **fair and ethical recruitment** and safe labour mobility



Migrants returning to their home country



Returning to home country means reuniting with loved ones and sharing the new skills, knowledge and experience with families and community members.

Outcome 4: Returning Pacific Islander migrant workers demonstrate increased social and labour market reintegration

- Pacific Governments are supported to provide **reintegration assistance for returning migrants and their families** to improve labour market and social reintegration

Partnerships

The project will adopt a **people-centred** and **whole-of-society** approach including migrant workers, recruiters, private sectors, workers and employers' organization, regional organizations and responsible agencies in governments, and embassies.
