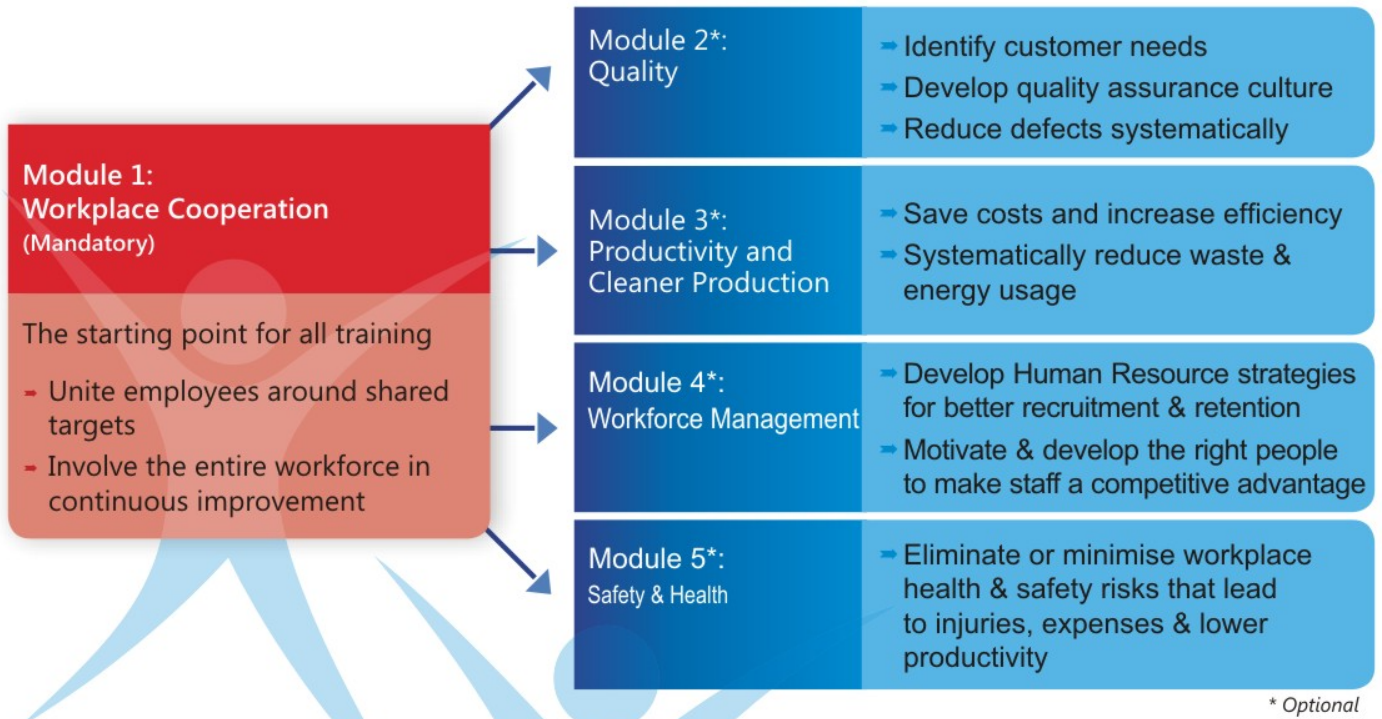

IMPACTS OF SCORE
