# Why address barriers?

Humanitarian-Development nexus Dignity in service delivery (less dependency)

Kenya as a CRRF country - KISEDP

Integration of refugees and host communities

Community
Participation in
development

## **Legal Framework**

- (International) 1951 Refugee Convention
- (Regional) 1969 African Union Convention Governing the Specific Aspects of Refugee Problems in Africa

Kenya is a signatory to both laws

## Framework cont.

- (Local) Refugee Act (2006)
- Kenya Citizenship and Immigration Regulations, 2012

#### THEORY VS PRACTICE

Refugee access to work permits is limited = refugees working in informal sector



# Barriers to formality at a glance

- Lack of/limited awareness on relevant laws/procedures and access to business development services – illegitimate entities
- Cost of business permit rates unachievable for refugees
- Different approach for refugee business persons with disabilities – limited privileges/benefits
- Freedom of movement restrictions limited competitiveness
- Restriction from registering community groups illegitimate groups



## Role of NRC

Removal of Barriers

Compliant/form al businesses = Sustainable Livelihoods Durable solutions – integration and reintegration

## **NRC** Priorities

- Increased access to business development documentation support – business permits
- Support towards the registration of refugee-led groups CBOs and SHGs
- Discussions around freedom of movement restrictions for entrepreneurship/work
- Enhancing access to civil and legal documentation
- Formalization of access to business premises procedures
- Inclusion of persons with disabilities



### Recommendations

- Concerted efforts toward advocacy initiatives engaging variety of actors to progressively address barriers, legal and policy influence (County and National levels)
- Practical application of KISEDP –integration, freedom of movement
- One-stop shop for business development and related services
- Increased awareness on business development procedures/services
