
LAUNCH OF THE LP HUB

On January 26, we officially launched the **ILO Labour Provisions in Trade Agreements Hub**, a one-stop source for information on labour provisions in more than 100 regional trade agreements in over 140 economies.

A groundbreaking tool, the Hub is designed to assist policymakers, technical experts, representatives of workers' and employers' organizations, and civil society with analysing and strengthening the understanding of trade agreements that include labour provisions.
