| Tripartism              | <ul> <li>Composite index - participation in<br/>public policy</li> </ul>  |
| Collective bargaining   | <ul><li>Collective bargaining coverage</li><li>Wage coordination</li><li>Level of bargaining</li></ul>  |
| Worker participation    | <ul> <li>Composite index - institutionalized worker representation at firm level</li> </ul>   |

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### Trade Union Density rate



#### Union membership as a proportion of the eligible workforce

- Union membership:
  - Actual active members (exclude retired workers, students..)
- Eligible workforce:
  - Exclude workers without the right to join a trade union
  - Employees (paid employment)
  - Employees + own account workers (or self-employed)
- Rates:
  - TUD EES (Male, Female)
  - TUD EES + OAW (Male, Female)
  - TUD EMP (Male, Female)
  - TUD Private / Public Sector

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### Trade Union Density rate



 $TUD = \frac{TUM - retired\ members, students\ etc.}{(EES)\ or\ (EES + OAW)\ or\ (EMP) - excluded\ from\ right}\ X\ 100$ 

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## Collective bargaining coverage rate



### Coverage by collective bargaining agreements as a proportion of the eligible workforce

- Coverage by collective bargaining agreement (CBA):
  - Include workers covered by extension of CBA
- Eligible workforce:
  - Exclude workers without the right to collective bargaining
  - Employees (paid employment)
  - Employees + own account workers (or self employed)
- Rates:
  - CBC EES (Male, Female)
  - CBC EES + OAW (Male, Female)
  - CBC EMP (Male, Female)
  - CBC Private / Public Sector


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
## Collective bargaining coverage rate



 $CBC = \frac{Coverage\ by\ CBA\ incl\ by\ extension}{(EES)\ or\ (EES+OAW)\ or\ (EMP)-excluded\ from\ right}\ X\ 100$ 

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


### Some findings

Relative difference between collective bargaining coverage rates as a proportion of employees and total employment



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Sources used to report Trade Union Membership and/or Collective Bargaining Coverage





Other sources Administrative Establishment 6% records by Surveys government 8% agencies 35% Labour Force Surveys 22% Administrative records by the trade unions 29%

Other sources include official estimates, collective bargaining agreements, insurance records and Labour Inspectorate records.
