- **Gender mainstreaming is a strategy** that seeks to ensure that women's and men's (and girls' and boys') differing experiences and concerns are taken into account at every step of the policy decision, implementation, and monitoring process.
- Within the context of the Decent Work Agenda, seek to achieve gender equality and eliminate discrimination in the world of work
- Gender mainstreaming in labour statistics requires:
  - Understanding the work-related issues that affect women, men, girls and boys
  - Ensuring that labour statistics accurately measure the identified topics and inform the public and decisionmakers
  - It is thus not sufficient to disaggregate standard labour market indicators by sex to achieve gender mainstreaming in labour statistics

### ILO's work programme on gender mainstreaming in labour statistics

- The ILO's work programme related to gender mainstreaming in labour statistics has focussed on three key areas:
  - Data collection and microdata processing
  - Capacity building, related video testimonials, and training videos
  - ILO collaboration in support of gender-relevant labour statistics and analysis

# ILO data collection and microdata processing

- Types of information collected or processed :
  - Yearly, quarterly and monthly indicators by sex collected and published in ILOSTAT along with metadata
  - Includes selected Decent Work Indicators and related SDG indicators supporting gender equality and decent work for all:
    - Examples: «Female share of employment in managerial positions" and "Informal employment rate by sex"
  - Microdata processing from household surveys allows construction of targeted indicators relevant for women and men in the world of work

Despite the progress, still important gaps in the available data by sex, including Decent Work indicators and related SDG indicators targeting gender equality

## Capacity building and related video testimonials (1)

- Strong emphasis on Gender mainstreaming in labour statistics during the 2015 Labour Market Statistics and Analysis (LMSA) Academy in Turin, Italy.
  - Academy was organized along three learning paths: (1) labour statisticians, (2) data analysts and (3) senior managers
- The 2015 LMSA Academy's gender and labour statistics experts shared their expertise with participants in the three learning paths during four sessions on gender mainstreaming in labour statistics.
  - 17th ICLS Checklist on mainstreaming gender in labour statistics emphasized
  - 19th ICLS Resolution on work statistics highlighted
    - Identification of paid and unpaid forms of work -> particular relevance for informing policy-makers on empowerment of women in the world of work.
