Description of the event

The ILO Department of Statistics, with funding from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and support from partners, has been working on a project to engender informality statistics since 2020. The project has tested survey methods, supported development of the new standards, and reviewed the use of informality statistics. A similar project is underway in the Arab States region supported by the Ford Foundation. The outputs will include gender-focused guidance and tools that will help countries to generate high-quality and actionable gender data on the informal economy.

This side event will present some of the findings, tools and guidance produced through the project, and celebrate the partnerships that have made this work possible. It will present the project activities and achievements, including the experiences of national partners: the Instituto Nacional de Estadística e Informática (INEI) Perú; the Uganda Bureau of Statistics (UBoS).
