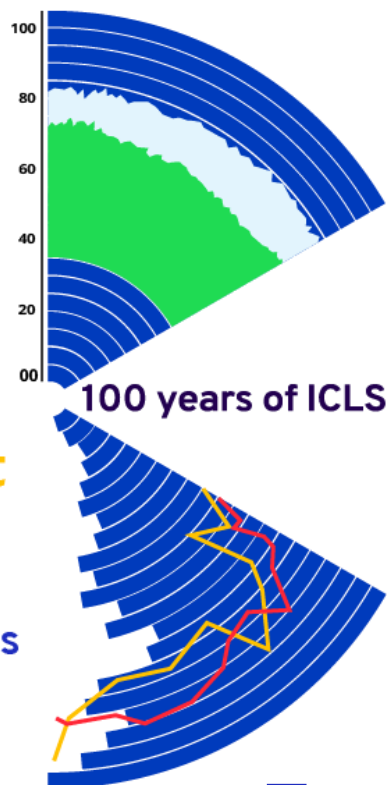

Our dedication to nurturing expertise contributes significantly to promoting **full and productive employment and decent work for all**, ensuring a brighter, more equitable future for all.



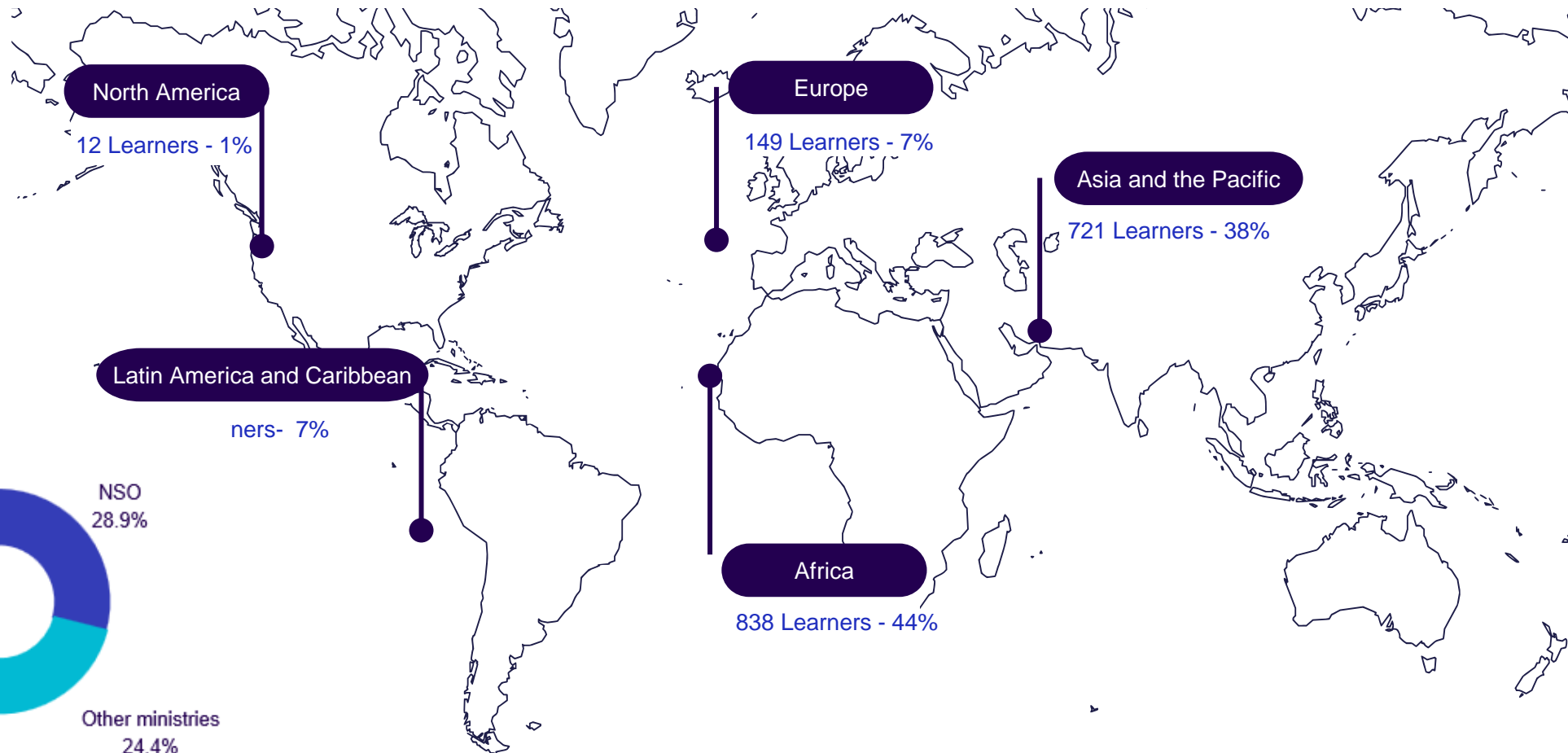

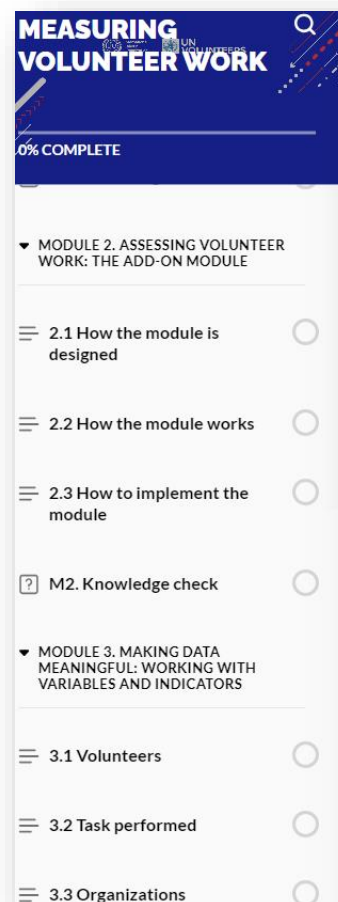

Why this course on measuring volunteer work

In recent years, national statistical offices (NSOs) worldwide have been paying greater attention to the measurement of volunteer work, which offers valuable evidence on people's contribution to the development and well-being of individuals and communities. **This course presents tools and recommendations that countries can use to produce such statistics and integrate volunteering effectively into national policies.**




The information presented here is the result of a process of continuous improvement of measurement tools. After the 19th [international conference of labour statisticians](#) (ICLS) in 2013 established new standards on work and labour market statistics, countries began to develop and implement specialized survey tools inspired by the [Manual on the Measurement of Volunteer Work](#) (ILO, 2011).

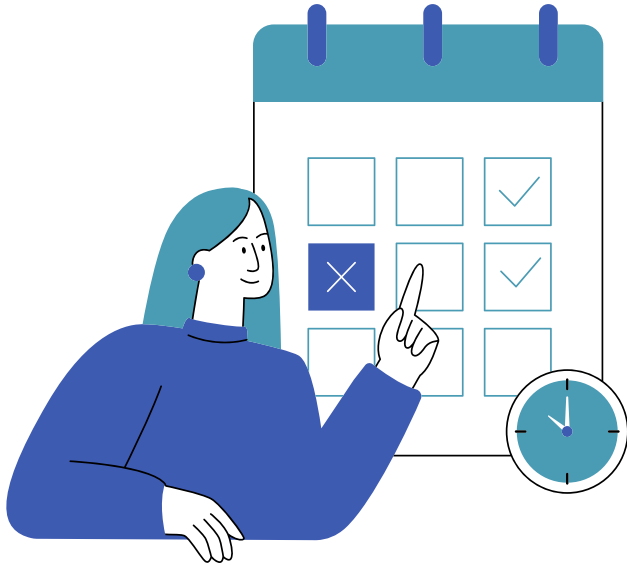

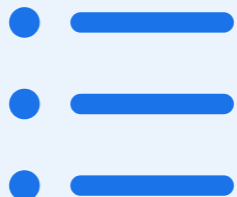
