





This course presents tools and recommendations that countries can use to produce such statistics and integrate

> The information presented here is the result of a process of continuous improvement of measurement tools. After the 19th international conference of labour statisticians (ICLS) in 2013 established new standards on work and labour market statistics, countries began to develop and implement specialized survey tools inspired by the Manual on the Measurement of Volunteer Work (ILO, 2011).


