1. Background

In 2020, the Governing Body of the ILO guided the Office to undertake a [follow-up plan of action on youth employment for the period 2020–30](#) in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic and the current and future needs of constituents in addressing the challenge of youth employment, while responding to an evolving world of work in the context of the ILO Centenary Declaration for the Future of Work. The action plan follows the resolution “The youth employment crisis: A call for action”, adopted by the International Labour Conference at its 101st Session (2012) and implemented by the ILO until 2019.

2. Purpose

This questionnaire aims at monitoring the progress of the proposed elements of the follow-up plan of action on youth employment 2020–30’s 10-year workplan (see Annex of the follow-up plan). It is structured around the three clusters of the implementation framework, namely, knowledge development and dissemination; technical assistance and capacity-building of constituents; and advocacy and partnerships, as well as on the five policy areas of the 2012 call for action. It will be analyzed in the framework of the three pillars of the human-centered approach proposed by the Centenary Declaration.

3. Recipients

The main recipients of this questionnaire are the member of the Interdepartmental Action Group (IDAG) on Youth Employment (see attached list) and other ILO staff working on youth employment-related issues.
