Addendum

Financial implications

1. In reference to document GB.323/INS/8(Rev.1), should the Governing Body decide to approve the proposed decision to send a high-level tripartite mission to Qatar to prepare a report for its 324th Session in June 2015, financial arrangements will need to be made to enable the mission to go ahead.
2. The tripartite mission will be comprised of one member from each group of the Governing Body, accompanied by three officials, over a period of five days. It is estimated that the total costs of the mission will amount to some US\$25,550, comprising:

3. It is proposed that the costs expected to be incurred for this mission would, in the first instance, be financed from savings that might arise under Part I of the budget or, failing that, through the use of the provision for unforeseen expenditure, Part II. Should this

subsequently prove impossible, the Director-General would propose alternative methods of financing at a later stage in the biennium.

Draft decision

4. *Should the Governing Body decide to send a high-level tripartite mission to Qatar, as indicated in the draft decision of document GB.323/INS/8(Rev.1), it further decides that the cost of the high-level mission, which is estimated at US\$25,550, be financed from savings that might arise under Part I of the budget or, failing that, through the use of the provision for unforeseen expenditure, Part II. Should this subsequently prove impossible, the Director-General would propose alternative methods of financing at a later stage in the biennium.*
