▶ Part I. Composition and agenda of standing bodies and meetings

Technical meeting on digitalization in the retail sector as an engine for economic recovery and decent work (Geneva, 25–29 September 2023)

1. At its 346th Session (October–November 2022), the Governing Body approved the list of official international organizations and non-governmental organizations ¹ to be invited as observers to the technical meeting. In addition to the already approved list, it is proposed that the International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF) be invited to the technical meeting as an observer.

Meeting of experts to update and adopt the 1998 ILO code of practice on safety and health in forestry work (Geneva, 13–17 May 2024)

2. At its 347th Session (March 2023), the Governing Body approved the holding of a meeting of experts to update the 1998 ILO code of practice on safety and health in forestry work. ² It is

- proposed that the meeting of experts be held from 13 to 17 May 2024 and be composed of eight experts nominated by governments, eight experts nominated by the Employers' group of the Governing Body, and eight experts nominated by the Workers' group of the Governing Body.
- **3.** Following consultations with the regional coordinators, it is proposed that the governments from the following countries be invited to nominate an expert: Brazil, Finland, Indonesia, New Zealand, South Africa, Spain, United Republic of Tanzania and the United States of America. Should any of these governments fail to nominate an expert, a government from the reserve list ³ will be invited to do so. All other governments will be invited to nominate one observer to the meeting.
- **4.** The Officers of the Governing Body recommend that the Governing Body endorse the list of Member States whose governments are invited to nominate experts to the meeting.
