Training to Trade Unions on Safe Migration and Victims' Assistance Nepal, July 2014

A pre-departure skills training curriculum was developed and a Training of Trainers workshop was conducted in July 2014 in Nepal. The ToT was held by the Global Alliance Against Trafficking in Women (GAATW) building the capacity of trainers to undertake pre-decision community work with potential migrant women workers.

Following the GAATW ToT, a core group of 6 trainers was formed in order to develop materials and undertake preparations to conduct 7 days district level training to the community workers in Nepal. The first district training was conducted in Morang jointly by the core trainer group under backstopping by one of the national core trainers of the GAATW. In total, 112 community workers (96 female and 16 male) including 46 Social Mobilizers from the local government were trained. Additionally, the implementation agreements were signed with the national NGOs for the period of September 2014 to November 2015 in follow up to the training activities, in particular with: Women's Rehabilitation Centre (WOREC) in Morang; ABC Nepal in Rupandehi, POURAKHI Nepal in Dolakha, and People Forum in Chitwan.

As of February 2015, 271 women/community groups (4,562 women; 982 men) were oriented on safe migration, women empowerment, benefits and challenges of foreign employment, and points to be considered while thinking about migrating for foreign employment.
