Instructions for presenters

Presentation Slides

To avoid complications with multiple versions of slides, this year we are asking participants to **bring presentation slides on a USB stick**. Please come to your presentation room 10 minutes before the session starts to save them on the laptop.

Time allocation

For the parallel sessions with three speakers, each presenter will have 20 minutes for presentation and 10 minutes for discussion. In case where four papers are allocated, adjustments should be made accordingly (e.g., 15 minutes for presentation, 8 minutes for discussion).

Entering the building

On the first day of the conference come to the ILO's R3 South Entrance to collect your security badge. Getting there is a bit complicated, but the route will be well signed. From the bus stop, the directions are as follows:

Go down the slope towards the building, which leads to an underground parking lot. Turn right at the entrance of the parking lot and go straight along the wall. You'll see a door on your right and an escalator inside. Take both escalators and then follow the signs to the final flight of stairs up to the R3 level. At the top of the stairs (on level R3) exit the building on your right and walk outside along the building to "door 1". Inside you can collect your security badge. Registration is on level R2 (one floor down). You will be given a name tag and Conference Package.
