




EC and EU Member State contributions as % of total, 2018-2020*




Total EC contributions 2012-2020*




The EC was ILO's second largest funding partner in the 2018-19 biennium, providing US\$106.6M in voluntary contributions, out of a total of \$ 799.6M.

Funds by EC funding instrument, 2018-2020*




EC contributions by region, 2018-2020*

ILO partnerships with UN agencies with EC support as well as with European development agencies

A key feature of the EC-ILO partnership is that many of the programmes are implemented through multi-stakeholder partnerships, often involving other UN agencies. There is also growing engagement with European development finance institutions and development agencies. **Examples include:**

- ILO and UNICEF are implementing a multi-country programme to improve synergies between social protection and public finance management
- **ILO, UNCDF, UNDP** and **ITU**, under the lead of **FAO** are collaborating to implement the UN Joint Programme to Support to Rural Entrepreneurship, Investment and Trade in Papua New Guinea
- With *GIZ and UNDP*, ILO is working in Bosnia and Herzegovina on private sector development to support competitiveness and innovation. In Timor-Leste, ILO and *GIZ* are, with EC funding, improving rural road access, creating employment, and promoting domestic revenue opportunities.
- ILO and *IOM* are supporting the economic and social resilience of Syrian refugees under Temporary Protection and of host communities in Turkey.
- ILO, IOM and GIZ are collaborating to strengthen migrant workers' protection mechanisms in the North of Africa.
- Joint ILO and *ICMPD* efforts foster dialogue between EU and the Government of India for better governance of migration and mobility. Also collaboration is fostering better labour migration governance for development and integration programme seeking to extend decent work and social protection to migrant workers
- Under the Spotlight Initiative, ILO and **UN Women** protect the rights of migrant domestic workers in ASEAN countries. UN Women and ILO also are promoting women's economic empowerment in selected G7 countries as well as collaborating in Latin America on gender equality, working with enterprises and employers organisations.
- With **OECD**, ILO is enhancing respect for decent work, human rights, and environmental sustainability through responsible business conduct in Asia and Latina America. The work in Latin America is jointly delivered with **OHCHR**.
- ILO is collaborating with AFD on Phase II of PECOBAT project (EC funded) in Mauritania, to stimulate local economic development in disadvantaged areas.
